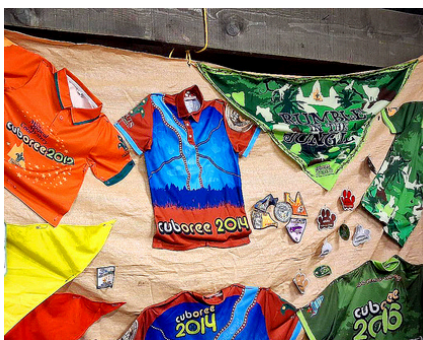
WHERE IT ALL STARTED

1st Queensland Cuboree – The first Queensland Cuboree took place at Stanthorpe Showgrounds in 2010 with the theme *'The Web of Life.'*

2nd Queensland Cuboree – The second event took place in 2012 at Seonee Park in Rockhampton. The theme of this year was *'The Magical Mystery Tour.'*

3rd Queensland Cuboree – The third Cuboree they took a trip to Maryborough Showgrounds in 2014. It was themed *'Time of Legends.'*

4th Queensland Cuboree – In 2016 the fourth Cuboree took place at Maryborough Showgrounds. The event had the theme *'Rumble in the Jungle.'*



5th Queensland Cuboree – Cuboree took place again at Maryborough Showgrounds in 2018, the theme for this year was *'Going Troppo.'*

6th Queensland Cuboree – The sixth Cuboree took place at Rocky Creek Campsite in Landsborough, 2021. This year was themed *'Around the World.'*

7th Queensland Cuboree – In 2023, the seven Cuboree took place in Maryborough Showgrounds, its theme was *'Choose your Own Adventure.'*

8th Queensland Cuboree – This year's Cuboree in 2026 was themed *'Shake It Up!'* and took place at BP Park in Samford.

Over the 8 Cuboree's that have occurred, the first one starting back in 2010 in Stanthorpe there have been leaders come and go. Eight spectacular people though, have stayed through it all. The first Cuboree which ended early because of flooding, though has been called a disaster on many occasions, didn't deter these eight wonderful people.



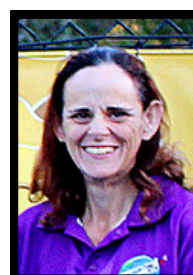
Julie Christenson started as a Welfare leader at the first two Cuborees, she has assisted in both Admin and Support Services and for the

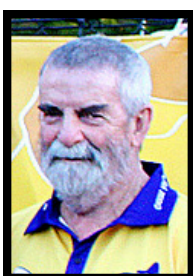
Jean Clifford, our current Assistant Chief Commissioner of Major Events has played a key role in make Cuboree possible, though she
